

FEEDING PROCEDURE

Updated 01 December 2025

- 1. All feeding bowls are colour coded for each horse/pony, details are found on the whiteboard in the feed room. Name tags are also available.
- 2. All feed and water bowls are to be regularly cleaned and disinfected on a weekly basis, more so if it is muddy.
- 3. All feed must be stored in vermin and waterproof containers and clearly labelled.
- 4. All medicines are to be secured in a locked storage container in the feed room. The Proprietor or Adult-in- Charge should have access to the key only.
- 5. No feed bowls are to be left out for a prolonged period of time to avoid vermin/accidental ingestion.
- All feed measurements/amounts are detailed on the whiteboard in the feed room. This
 will be updated by the Proprietor if/when feed regimes alter due to seasonal or
 workload changes.
- 7. Care should be taken when filling bowls not to spill foodstuffs onto the floor.
- 8. All surfaces and floor should be thoroughly swept after feed bowls distributed.
- 9. Horses/ponies ideally should be in stables when given feed. If unavoidable, care must be given to evenly space our feed using hooked buckets on the fences.
- 10. During the winter months, adequate forage must be available at all times. Hay is stored in the Hay Barn. Each horse/pony to have access to at least one large slice of forage in the evenings with one extra slice down for the number of ponies in the field.
- 11. Haynets must be replenished every day in the stables and secured properly on baler twine. Care should be given to avoid putting out dusty/mouldy roughage.
- 12. Any horses/ponies with respiratory/dietary issues must have soaked hay.
- 13. Any waste feed is to be disposed of in the shown area at Site 5. This is for burning/disposal without attracting vermin.
- 14. Daily checks of water troughs undertaken, twice daily for winter/icy weather and frozen troughs/buckets to be broken through to allow access.
- 15. All water buckets in stables to be replenished daily and covered by bucket lid.
- 16. All feeding to be administered by an adult unless supervised in a stable management lesson.
